The session was led by Prof. Kellen Kiambati Director Resource Mobilization and was accompanied by Director QA &ISO Dr. Charles Wahogo, Director Research, Innovation amd Extension Prof. Michael Lokuruka among some members of staff to reflect on the institution's innovation journey and explore opportunities for growth.
