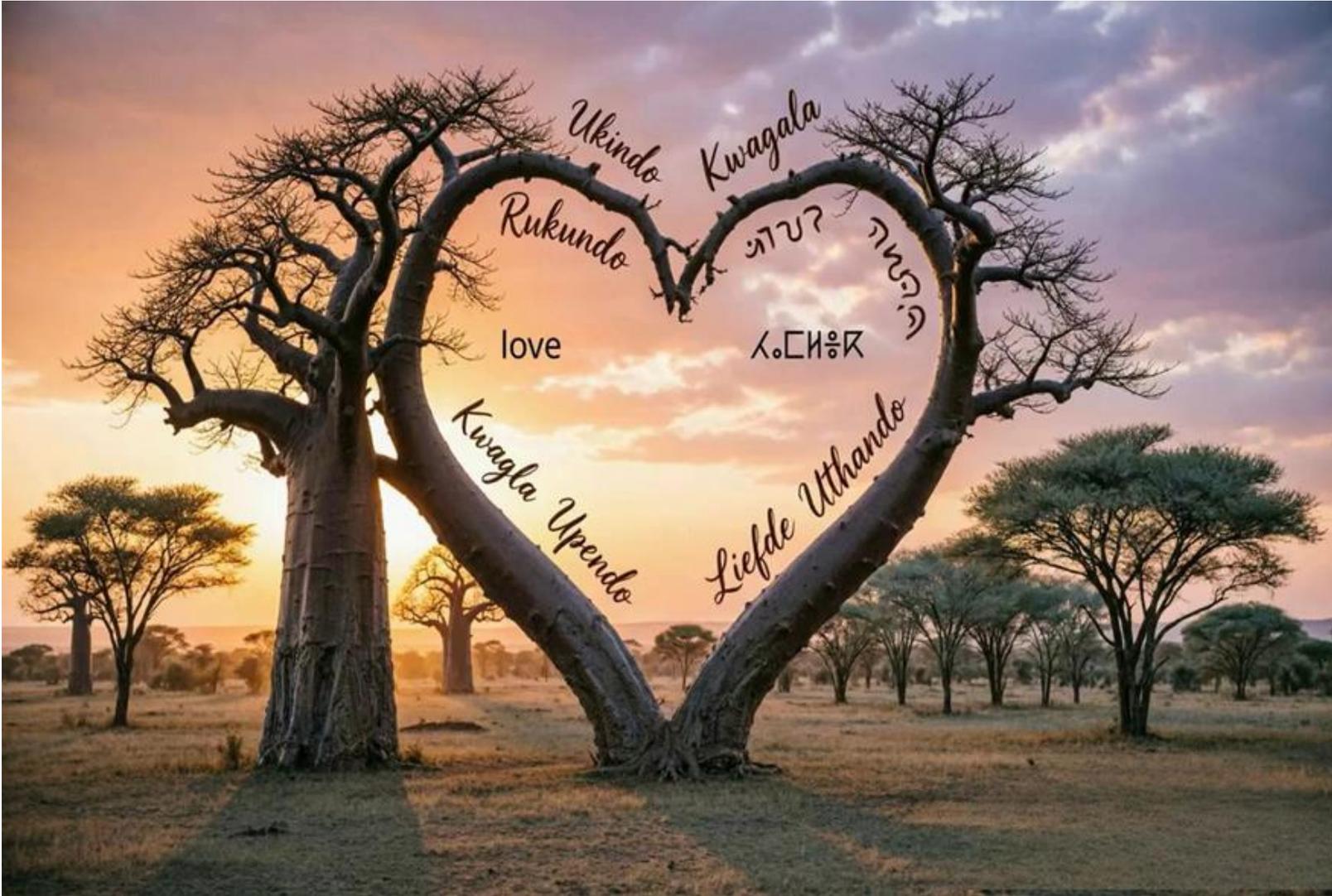

# What is to humanize learning?

# As learning is taking place ...

- ❖ Am I seen and heard?
- ❖ Is the teacher listening with an open heart, open mind and open will?
- ❖ Simply put... Students do not only need lessons — they need someone **who sees them, protects their dreams, and believes in their capacity to rise.**

# Current learning system

- ❖ Do they look at learning Systems as **Social Architects. Creating the future they want as learners**
- ❖ Colonial vs decolonial & humanising learning
- ❖ Critical thinking & agency vs outcome-driven schooling?
- ❖ Community, collaboration & knowledge exchange
- ❖ Political & policy influences on education
- ❖ Education, identity & **moral formation**
- ❖ *Urgency to rethink & redesign learning systems (part of what we are doing today)*

# Current learning system

- ❖ Exam-centred & standardized learning
- ❖ Theory–practice disconnect
- ❖ Neglect of socio-emotional & life skills
- ❖ Outdated paradigms
- ❖ Conflict & fragile contexts
- ❖ Loss of purpose of education: why are UG students dropping to do content creation? Can we help them to monetize each course?

## Practical Steps

- ❖ Communities of Inquiry to share ideas per school or per department
- ❖ Teaching squares
- ❖ Co-creating learning activities per cohort
- ❖ Working with the community: make assignment authentic (AI)
- ❖ Pedagogy of care and Social Presence
- ❖ Designing learning experiences where students collaboratively create and improve ideas of value to their community (share Maseno Univ ex)
- ❖ Foster a welcoming atmosphere (share my experience)

## Practical Steps

- ❖ Foster a welcoming atmosphere (share my experience)
- ❖ Leverage technology creatively: Use tools for personal, interactive feedback (e.g., video feedback) rather than just automated
- ❖ Valuing the unique cultural, social, and academic backgrounds that students bring to the classroom and focusing on student voice in learning
- ❖ Finally, Reflection – what worked, where should we improve

# Note from Africa Voices....

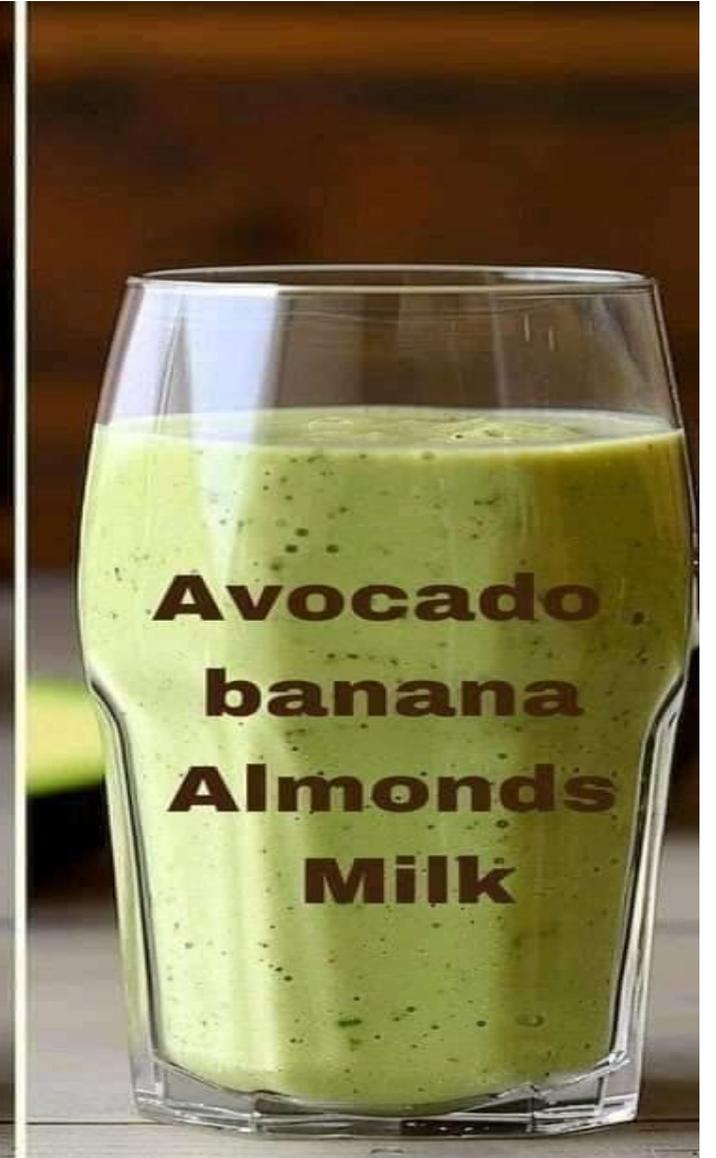
- The 21<sup>st</sup> century has been marked by a **crisis of care and belonging.**
